Monthly Presentations

September: *Judah P. Benjamin: The Jewish Confederate* was the topic of interest following the September General meeting. Presented by James Devine, a retired high school history teacher and a lecturer at Bergen Community College, Benjamin held key positions in the Confederacy, including Secretary of State and Secretary of War.

Prior to the Civil War, Benjamin served as a United States Senator from Louisiana. After Louisiana seceded from the Union, he moved to Richmond after CSA President Jefferson Davis named him Attorney General. Benjamin entered Yale College at age 14, but left without graduating. He became an authority in commercial law, which served him well in New Orleans' busy port.

Benjamin was the first Jew to be elected to the U.S. Senate who had not renounced his faith, and was the first to hold a cabinet position in North America.

The lecture also highlighted key events during the Civil War. Benjamin fled after the defeat of the South and became a noted English barrister.

Hobbyists are encouraged to attend lectures from 11:00 to 12 noon that follow the General Meeting.
