Monthly Presentations

History Themes at Recent Programs

Hobbyists **Peter Phillip** and **Joe Suplicki** presented interesting programs following recent general meetings: In May, Peter discussed the Presidential Elections of 1912 and 1916, both won by Woodrow Wilson. The 1912 election featured a challenge from former President Theodore Roosevelt as well as incumbent William Howard Taft. In 1916, Wilson won re-election by a narrow margin over Charles Evans Hughes.

Joe and wife Peggy Norris provided a look back at the history of Ridgewood circa 1865-1876 at the June meeting. The presentation includes old photos and maps in the area once part of Franklin Township. One photo depicted current streets like Prospect and Maple as dirt roads. Other illustrations showed farms with the main staples of the day—honey, strawberries, tomatoes, and hay, among others. Some of today's structures were shown shortly after they were built. A building boom by gentleman farmers in the years following the Civil War was halted due to a Depression in 1873, and shortly after, Ridgewood incorporated as a Township in 1876. One of the driving forces behind Ridgewood's growth was the railroad, (1848). Ridgewood became a Village in 1894.
