Monthly Presentations - The Opioid Crisis

The Valley Hospital staff provided an interesting—and sobering—look at the current opioid crisis in America following the September general meeting.

From 1999 through 2015, opioid use more than tripled, leading to unprecedented deaths and overdoses. At its zenith, the massive use of opioids was enough to provide every American with 24-hour coverage for three weeks. Since 2015, the use of opioids has flattened, and efforts are already underway to lessen the devastating negative impact. Options such as topical analgesics; acupuncture; chiropractic care; exercise; massage, and non-steroidal drugs were cited as alternative approaches to pain.

October 3 Meeting - Ridgewood Symphony Orchestra

A woodwind ensemble from the Ridgewood Symphony Orchestra will perform an eclectic mix of music at the Hobbyists Unlimited membership meeting. The RSO is one of the top community orchestras in New Jersey and one of only three in Bergen County.
